
Circulation Statistics

### DID YOU KNOW?

Online Web Resources are Bookmarked on the <u>Library Website</u>

Throughout the year all students participate in research assignments. The library's website is a fantastic place for students to begin their searches.

By clicking on the Research tab, students can find links to databases, citation guides, and teacher-approved websites organized by curriculum.

Free bookmarks are available in the library to remind students of the database username and login details so they may access them from home.



## **How Can I Help You?**

Here are some of the library activities that occurred in February.

- Purchased 15 biblical commentaries for Mrs. Wisinki's sophomores to support their exegetical research. Hosted all sophomore theology students for four days as they worked on their research outlines.
- Delivered a mini-lesson on quote introductions, in-text citations, and works cited pages to Ms. Burkholder's students. Added tie-ins to the library website.
- In response to requests from Mr. Ahmed's chemistry students, installed Movie Maker on the library PCs to supplement iMovie on the Macs.
- Worked one-on-one with Ms. Meneilly's world history students to brainstorm ideas, research, and revise their "What If?" projects.
- Purchased books and DVDs for the film studies courses and English Lab.
- Supplied tutoring space for Mrs. Borchers as she worked with students on writing literary criticism.
- Worked with Mr. Lupton's class to find icons of the American West and research the Houston Rodeo and Livestock Show history.
- Collaborated with Mrs. Osterman to purchase a set of 12 animal life encyclopedias, noted to be one of the most authoritative sources for animal classifications and descriptions.
- Administered 172 make-up and extended time exams.
- Helped Mrs. Pettit's speech students brainstorm and write about overcoming fears.
- Introduced Mrs. Petersen's juniors to the online library catalog and various databases as they hunted for resources for their research papers.
